SWA Celebrates 75 Years of Art!

In 1937 Josephine Hancock Logan wrote a book titled, "Sanity in Art," in an attempt to place before the public, a statement for the reasons for forming the society called "Sanity in Art." Josephine and her husband, Frank Granger Logan, established the Logan Medal award at the Chicago Institute of Art in 1917 for meritorious work by outstanding painters. As the years went by the "modern art" movement moved further and further into the art world, creating an outcry of dismay by the public. In her book, Josephine states, "Sanity in Art means soundness, rationalism, a correct integration of art work itself in accordance with some internal logic." She felt that the movement for Sanity in Art is a road for opening whereby the best possible representation of the highest ideals in art may be brought about. The first Annual Exhibition for Sanity in Art was held in 1939. Thus, our organization was formed.

After winning his high school Art Prize in 1960, Jim Caldwell went on to major in art at Williams College. He spent the year following graduation at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris, and traveled extensively, doing watercolors, drawings and paintings. Jim returned to the U.S. for graduate school at Yale, where he received his Master of Architecture Degree in 1969.

Jim has had over 40 one-man shows and participated in thirty group shows. His paintings are in over 350 private collections. Jim divides his time between painting and residential architectural design at his studio in Woodside. He teaches painting and drawing in the Stanford Continuing Studies Program.




